Supporting Girls and Mothers in Mombasa County

As the festive season set in, KUCCPS visited Mahad Nurul Huda at Marikiti, Mombasa. The institution offers Islamic studies and computer classes to girls and mothers who missed the opportunity to further their education.

KUCCPS Huduma Centre Officer addressed more than 150 girls and mothers, highlighting available education pathways and the importance of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) courses as a practical route to skills development and economic empowerment.



KUCCPS Engages Learners in Kitui County



In Kitui County, KUCCPS participated in the Kathonzweni Parish Youth Forum held at Vitale HGM Comprehensive School. The forum, attended by the Education Secretary of the Catholic Diocese of Wote, Sr. Regina, and the Kathonzweni Youth Patron, brought together a diverse group of learners and education stakeholders.

A total of 567 students from senior and comprehensive schools participated, alongside 89 Form Four leavers, 234 Junior Secondary School students, and six parents. The engagement provided an opportunity to guide learners on career choices, education pathways, and the KUCCPS placement process.

Impacting Youth in Makueni through Career Guidance

KUCCPS was also represented at a week-long Makueni Form Four Leavers and Youth Career Guidance Forum held at St. John's Malivani. During the forum, KUCCPS officers engaged learners on career opportunities, informed course selection, and placement procedures. The forum reached 479 students from senior and comprehensive schools, 75 Form Four leavers, and 198 Junior Secondary School students. The host Parish Priest, Fr. Nicholus, together with parish youth officials, also participated in the sessions, reinforcing the importance of structured career guidance for young people.



KUCCPS Participates in CBE Retooling for Senior School Teachers

In Kajiado County, KUCCPS participated in the Competency-Based Education (CBE) Retooling Programme for Senior School Teachers. The KUCCPS officer from the GPO Huduma Centre facilitated a session focusing on the role of KUCCPS in the implementation of CBE. Through the programme, 320 teachers drawn from 60 schools across two sub-counties have so far been sensitized on learner placement and education pathways under the CBE framework.



Taking Career Guidance to the Grassroots through Huduma Mashinani

As part of efforts to promote equitable access to education and career guidance, KUCCPS joined the Huduma Mashinani outreach at Voi Constituency in Taita Taveta County, in collaboration with Huduma Centre Wundanyi.
