Re-appointment of KUCCPS Board Chairman

Cabinet Secretary for Education, Hon. Julius Migos Ogamba, EBS has re-appointed Mr. Cyrus Gituai OGW, EBS, CBS as the Chairman of the Kenya Universities and Colleges Central Placement Service (KUCCPS) Board. In a Kenya Gazette Notice dated 25th July 2025, Mr. Ogamba indicated that the appointment is for three years, effective from the same date.

Mr. Gituai's re-appointment follows a successful three-year tenure, during which he steered KUCCPS Board through important milestones. Courtesy Visit by Zambian Higher Education Authority

During the visit, on July 21, 2025, Dr. Christopher Yegon, Director for Strategy, Planning and Quality Assurance, led the KUCCPS team in presenting the institution's mandate, strategic direction, and automated placement process. Prof. John Oluoch, Director for Placement Coordination and Career Development, highlighted that placements prioritise applicant choices and merit while considering approved institutional capacities. The visit concluded with lessons for Zambia in establishing a similar system.

Embu County Career Fair



KUCCPS partnered with ECPDA for a career fair at St. Peter's Primary and Junior School in Ishiara, attracting over 1,000 students from 10 secondary schools. 
