Career Sensitisation Forum, Taita Taveta County

KUCCPS recently held a week-long career sensitization programme in Taita Taveta County, reaching over 6,200 students and 65 teachers from 65 schools. The outreach focused on university and college placement, application processes, and career planning, with emphasis on STEM, BETA, and TVETA programs. Sensitisation of Form Four Students at Jamhuri High School, Nairobi

KUCCPS sensitised 273 Form Four students at Jamhuri High School in Nairobi on July 30, 2025. The sensitisation was meant to guide them on selection of courses and prepare them for the coming placement application processes, to ensure they are well informed about available career options. It had been noted that many previous candidates from the school had not applied for placement to universities and colleges, and were seeking late consideration, underscoring the importance of early preparation and awareness.
