

The month of September began with a series of outreach activities including in Turkana and Elgeyo Marakwet Counties. This issue presents briefs on these and other engagements held over the past one week.

Focus on Turkana County: KUCCPS undertakes weeklong campaign

Turkana University: A KUCCPS team led by Director, Placement Coordination and Career Development, Prof. John Oluoch, attended the Matriculation Ceremony at Turkana University. The team also engaged with key stakeholders including students, teachers, parents and members of the community members in a career guidance session and a capacity building workshop for career teachers.



Earlier, Prof. Oluoch, accompanied by other KUCCPS officers, paid a courtesy call on Turkana County Director of Education Dr. Henry Lubanga on 1st September, 2025. Their discussion focused on strengthening career guidance and student placement in the county.

The team was also at St. John Primary School where they engaged with 364 candidates from four schools, explaining KUCCPS processes. They held another session with 110 learners at St. Joseph Primary School, where they provided insights on the Competency-Based Education (CBE) system.



KUCCPS officers also conducted an outreach activity in Turkana North, where they held an interactive session with 460 candidates from four schools. Additionally, 16 teachers were trained on career guidance delivery. In a separate session, Prof. Oluoch engaged 98 Grade 8 and 9 learners from Lakitaung Comprehensive School on CBE matters.



Mombasa County: Good news to aspiring doctors as school of medicine launched

Technical University of Mombasa launched its School of Medicine last week in the presence of stakeholders. KUCCPS officials were delighted to witness the momentous event, which was a major milestone in expanding opportunities for aspiring medical students. Mombasa Governor H.E. Abdulswamad Shariff Nassir and other county leaders were present.



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Elgeyo Marakwet: Sensitisation for Students and Career Guidance Teachers

To strengthen career guidance in Elgeyo Marakwet County, KUCCPS conducted a capacity building on career guidance for teachers, during a sensitisation held at Sambirir Girls High School. Seventeen teachers attended, while the County and Sub-County Directors of Education, Sub-County TSC Director and the host principal were in attendance. The highlight was an interactive session with 242 KCSE candidates, which focused on placement processes, career pathways, and available opportunities for the learners.



KUCCPS officers conducted a similar activity at Moi Kapsowar Girls High School, Elgeyo Marakwet, for a sensitisation session. The session featured engagements with 335 candidates and 30 teachers, aimed at guiding them on career choices and opportunities.



Another fruitful discussion was conducted at St. Patrick's High School, Iten, bringing together 17 teachers from 15 different schools across the county. KUCCPS remains steadfast in its mission to nurture careers through continuous outreach and engagement.
