KUCCPS Represented as State House Talks Review Higher Education Successes



Chief Executive Officer Dr. Agnes Mercy Wahome represented KUCCPS in a meeting between His Excellency President Dr. William Ruto, Vice-Chancellors of Public Universities and Ministry of Education officials, held at State House. The meeting reviewed successes in the implementation of the student-centered higher education enhancing model, and explored measures for sustaining and enhancing access to university education in Kenya.

Our public universities are making steady and demonstrable progress in strengthening their role of teaching and training Kenya's human capital," His Excellency the President said after the meeting.



Improved Service Delivery earns KUCCPS an **Excellent Productivity Score**

The Placement Service improved its performance in key service delivery areas, according to the latest productivity assessment. In the assessment, which was conducted in September 2025, KUCCPS attained a Productivity Index of 4.4 (Excellent) for the Financial Year 2024/2025, up from 3.23 (Very High) in 2023/2024.

Productivity Index is a score derived from a public entity's performance in defined areas, covering delivery of core services, innovation, customer satisfaction, and employee satisfaction among other parameters. Metrics are developed and measured annually with the guidance of the National Productivity and Competitiveness Centre under the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection. The highest possible attainable Productivity Index is 5. This achievement underscores our commitment to excellence in public service and continuous improvement, driven by our keen focus on citizens.

Departments Gear Up for Audit Ahead of ISO 9001:2015 Recertification



All departments at KUCCPS are preparing for an audit that will determine if the institution retains its ISO 9001:2015 certification. ISO champions — officers assigned the role of supporting ISO processes — participated in a workshop in September to review and update Standard Operating Procedures ahead of the audit.

KUCCPS attained the ISO 9001:2015 Quality Management Systems (QMS) certification by the Kenya Bureau of Standards on 7th November 2022. The certification has enabled the institution to enhance customer satisfaction, improve operational efficiency and promote a culture of continuous improvement. The initiative underscores KUCCPS' commitment to provision of equitable, fair and efficient services.



QUALITY POLICY STATEMENT

The Kenya Universities and Colleges Central Placement Service (KUCCPS) is a state Corporation under the Universities Act 2012. The core mandate of KUCCPS is to coordinate the placement of Government sponsored students to Universities and Colleges as per the Act. 
A Week of Inspiration in Kitui County as KUCCPS Transverses Mwingi North Constituency offering Career Guidance
