Kiambu County: KUCCPS Sensitises Students at Mang'u High School

KUCCPS attended a sensitisation session at Mang'u High School in Kiambu County that hosted 674 candidates and three teachers. The KUCCPS team offered practical guidance on course selection, emerging career options and placement processes.
