## Nyeri County – Sparking Career Conversations

Our journey began in Nyeri Central at a lively student-focused forum organised by Quo Vadis Youth Hub. KUCCPS joined a multi-agency panel to engage over 300 Form Four leavers and candidates from Wamagana Girls' and St. Mary's Boys' Secondary Schools. Learners received practical guidance on career choices, placement, funding, and post-secondary pathways, with insights from HELB, KASNEB, and several universities.



## Murang'a County – Empowering Youth in Kiharu



In Kiharu Constituency, KUCCPS joined higher education stakeholders for a youth sensitisation forum that reached 614 Form Four leavers. The session brought together universities, TVET colleges, HELB, and KASNEB, offering learners a clear picture of the training and career opportunities ahead.



## Kirinyaga County – One-on-One Community Engagement

Led by CEO Dr Agnes Mercy Wahome, the KUCCPS team participated in a citizen engagement forum at Kianwe Primary School. The interactive session allowed close engagement with about 50 students, highlighting available opportunities, application procedures, and the value of making informed career decisions.



## Busia County – Three Days of Youth Empowerment

At Chamasiri TVC in Teso North Constituency, Busia County, KUCCPS participated in a three-day Youth Empowerment Conference. Over 2,000 youths and parents were sensitised on higher education and training opportunities, making it one of the most impactful engagements of the month.





## Mombasa County – Career Day at Tononoka



The coastal leg of our journey took us to Tononoka Social Hall in Mvita Constituency, where 800 youths, parents, teachers, and Form Four leavers attended a vibrant career day organised by Nurturing Stars Organisation. The event, graced by Mombasa Governor Abdulswamad Sharrif Nassir and other leaders, focused on placement and career guidance.

## Kitui County – Supporting Learners and Parents

In Kitui, our officers engaged students and parents during a scholarship issuance ceremony at Kitui Multipurpose Hall, organised by the Office of the County Woman Representative. We also participated in the Catholic Diocese of Kitui Career Day at John Paul II Institute, reaching learners, parents, and teachers with guidance on career pathways and post-secondary options.

## Kisumu County – Guiding the Transition to Higher Learning



At Obwolo Senior School in Kisumu East, our Huduma Centre officer addressed parents and Grade 10 students during a parents' meeting, offering timely guidance on the transition from secondary school to higher learning.

## Vihiga County – Reaching Multiple Schools

In Vihiga County, KUCCPS facilitated enriching career guidance sessions at Mudavadi Girls' High School, engaging students and educators from 16 schools. Additional sessions at Moi Girls' Vokoli in Sabatia Constituency reached representatives from 31 secondary schools.



## Kajiado County – Goal-Setting at CITAM Rongai

Our team also met Form Four leavers at CITAM Church, Rongai, where discussions focused on career choices and practical goal-setting strategies to help learners plan confidently for life after secondary school.





## Nairobi County – Nurturing Dreams in the City

At Light Academy, KUCCPS participated in a career day engaging over 200 students, 180 parents, and teachers on subject selection and career pathways. We also visited Eastleigh Senior School to sensitise Grade 10 learners on KUCCPS' role in implementing the Competency Based Education system.



## Kiambu County – Engaging Learners at Alliance High School

In Kiambu County, our officers held an engaging session with Grade 10 students at Alliance High School, answering questions and unpacking career pathways. In Juja Constituency, KUCCPS partnered with Glory Outreach Assembly to guide Form Four leavers from children's homes, alongside HELB, on life after secondary school and funding opportunities.





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## Meru County – Career Sensitisation at MCK St. Mark Church



In Igembe North Constituency, KUCCPS and higher education stakeholders guided 126 Form Four leavers on career choices and post-secondary pathways, alongside representatives from HELB, universities, and teacher training colleges.

## Uasin Gishu County – Supporting Learners and Parents

Our team sensitised Grade 10 parents and students at Fr. Diaz Girls High School in Moiben Constituency, followed by sessions with Form Three and Form Four students, teachers, and school leadership.



## Homabay County – Learning Meets Opportunity



In Ndhiwa Constituency, Homabay County, KUCCPS engaged Grade 9 and Grade 10 learners and teachers at Sigama Senior School during the launch of a new computer laboratory. Discussions focused on smooth transitions to higher learning and future career planning.
